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## RESEARCH AND CLINICAL OUTCOMES FOR PALIN PARENT CHILD INTERACTION THERAPY (Palin PCI)

Recipients of the Emily Hughes-Hallett Bursaries are invited to attend a one-day workshop with Dr Sharon Millard, Research Lead and Clinical Lead Speech and Language Therapist at the Michael Palin Centre on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2017. The individual bursaries include a one day workshop on developing the evidence base for Palin PCI. Other therapists who have attended Palin PCI training are also welcome to attend.

### **Aims**

This workshop is aimed at those who would like to know more about the research in Palin PCI and some suitable measures of outcome. The workshop is primarily intended for Emily Hughes-Hallett Bursary recipients, but a number of places are available for others working with Palin PCI to attend.

The workshop will be discussion-based and Sharon hopes to talk with you about what we know about the research into Palin PCI to date; how this applies to clinical practice; the limitations of the research; and, the value in collecting local data. We will talk you through the assessments and protocol used at the Michael Palin Centre and we hope that you will then develop your own data collection processes to take forward locally.

***It is critical that each participant has attended Palin PCI training prior to attending the workshop.***

### **Learning Outcomes**

At the end of this workshop participants will have an understanding of:

- the strengths and limitations of research into Palin Parent-Child Interaction Therapy to date;
- the importance of local data collection;
- outcome measures available; and
- some data collection methods that may be incorporated into the clinical environment.

### **Pre-Workshop Considerations**

The course will be largely discussion based and to facilitate this, participants will be provided with some reading prior to the course. In advance, participants are encouraged to consider what would be helpful for them to know about Palin PCI from a research perspective, perhaps in relation to their own working context.
