Consultations and Reviews

(funded by Action for Stammering Children)

We value working closely with local SLT teams. The most appropriate therapist to attend the consultation or review is someone who knows the client so we can make shared decisions about future management.

Where possible, if the attending SLT has some experience/ training in working with clients who stammer, and will be available to work with the client in future, this will make it easier for you to deliver further local therapy, if required. We request that local language assessment is completed prior to the consultation.

At the start of the consultation/ review the MPC team talks to the local SLT about previous therapy/ progress. Typically the local SLT then observes the parent interview. When the child assessment and parent interview are completed the local SLT discusses the findings with the MPC team so that shared decisions can be made. If therapy is to be carried out locally we will write to you and the family to offer you a review in 6 months time. In the event that further therapy at the MPC is indicated we will discuss the options with you and outline funding implications.

Some therapists choose to attend the consultation or review appointment via Skype.

Clinical Reports

Following the assessment you will receive a copy of the clinical report for your client with the agreed recommendations.

Training

We are committed to developing SLT's knowledge and confidence in working with clients who stammer. A full programme of training courses is available on our website including a 'Which course to take' guide depending on your experience and interest. Action for Stammering Children subsidises the Centre's comprehensive programme of training.



Supervision

We offer individual and group supervision. This typically takes place on a monthly or bi-monthly basis either face-to-face or via Skype.

Research

We run a programme of research, investigating the nature of stammering and its impact on children, adults and their families. Studies of the effectiveness of therapy are also being carried out at the Centre. Look out on our website for information about latest courses, conferences and study days.
